OUR COMMITMENT TO PLANTING 2 BILLION TREES

Last month, we kicked off the 2023 tree-planting season. We announced a Contribution Agreement between the federal and BC provincial governments under the 2 Billion Trees (2BT) program. Under this agreement, over 37 million trees will be planted in BC in the next two years.


Trees are essential to our lives and important allies in our fight against

climate change. The 2BT program provides financial support to organizations to plant trees across our country over 10 years.

Healthy forest ecosystems are home to thousands of life forms. Forests supply us with food, provide shelter, and hold spiritual significance for many, particularly within Indigenous cultures.

Planting two billion trees is a significant step forward as we address climate change and biodiversity loss. These trees will improve air and water quality, cool our urban centres, and create

and support thousands of sustainable jobs.
Together with provinces, territories, Indigenous governments, and non-profit organizations, we will reach our two billion trees goal.



SUPPORTING OUR NURSES





Over the last few years, Canada's nurses have faced unprecedented demands and rapidly changing environments. Despite these challenges, more than 400,000 nurses continue to provide skilled and compassionate care in our hospitals, long-term care homes, and other healthcare settings.

Recognizing the critical role nurses play in our health care system, and to help provide nurses with the support and resources they need, last year we appointed Dr. Leigh Chapman as the new Chief Nursing Officer of Canada. Dr. Chapman has been working with key partners, including provinces and territories, on key priority policy and program areas related to nursing, such as addressing nursing retention.

Under Dr. Chapman's leadership, Health

Canada will host a hybrid Nursing Retention Forum in June 2023. This will be a unique opportunity for experts, decision makers and key nursing stakeholders from across the country to come together in support of the nursing workforce. The goal is to co-develop a toolkit with evidenceinformed strategies that employers can implement to support nursing retention within their organizations.

DID YOU KNOW: CONSULAR SERVICES

Summer vacation is almost here! That means travel season is just around the corner. I want to make sure everyone is aware of the consular services available to Canadians when you're outside the country.

Consular services provide help and advice to citizens who are living or traveling overseas. Consular services include:

- Safety, security, and medical emergencies
- Passports, immigration, permanent residence, and visas
- Legal and local law enforcement
- Death abroad
- General services.

Each case is different, meaning the type and amount of consular services provided depends on the situation.

Before you leave Canada for your trip, make sure you:

- Buy travel insurance
- Consult travel advice and advisories often
- Sign up for the Registration of Canadians Abroad Service (travel.gc.ca/ travelling/registration)
- Have a valid Canadián passport

- Subscribe to Global Affairs Canada travel updates
- Find the contact information for the closest embassy or consulate to your location.
